Description:

5 Bunker Hill Drive is a two-story tall, two-bay wide, four-bay deep, frame private residence constructed circa 1915 in a vernacular style. The dwelling, which sits on a concrete foundation, has a rectangular footprint no additions. The front-gabled roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles and features delicate ogee brackets below the overhanging eaves. An exterior brick, capped chimney punctures the roof on the southwest elevation. The exterior of the dwelling is covered with stucco. Windows on the first and second floors of the front elevation are two-over-two, double-hung wood-sash (likely original) with molded wood surrounds and louvered shutters. The historic entrance, a typical six-light cottage door (two tall vertical panels below two rows of inset lights), sits in the west bay on front elevation. A front-gabled entry porch with square posts (added to the dwelling after 1933) shelters the entrance, which is accessed via a concrete stoop trimmed with bricks. The northwest and southeast elevations feature two-over-two, double-hung, wood-sash windows (likely original) with molded wood surrounds and louvered shutters in an asymmetrical arrangement. A secondary entrance consisting of a single door sheltered by a frontgabled hood supported by brackets, is located in the south bay on the southeast elevation. The rear elevation is not visible from the public right-of-way. Character-defining elements of the dwelling include wood-sash windows and ogee brackets supporting overhanging eaves. A one-story, front-gabled frame garage, constructed circa 1930, stands south of the dwelling.

History: 5 Bunker Hill Drive first appears cartographically on the 1916 Sanborn map of Cranbury Township as a two-story frame dwelling with a one-story porch on the front elevation. The 1933 Sanborn map shows the subject dwelling with a one-story rear addition, removed

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Setting:

5 Bunker Hill Drive is sited on a rectangular parcel (Block 23, Lot 40) located on the south side of Bunker Hill Drive in Cranbury Township, Middlesex County, New Jersey. The dwelling is oriented with its primary elevation facing northeast and is set back approximately 12 feet from Bunker Hill Drive. A concrete sidewalk, which runs along the south side of Bunker Hill Drive, spans the entirety of the north side of the parcel. A paved driveway leads south from Bunker Hill Drive past the southeast side of the dwelling to a detached garage. A minimal front lawn is planted in grass. Shrubs and perennial plantings abut the porch, and a young tree is planted in the northwest corner of the lawn. 5 Bunker Hill Drive is located in a primarily residential neighborhood surrounded by other residential properties dating from the midnineteenth to the early-twentieth century.


