Description:

Odd Fellows Hall at 30 North Main Street is a two-story-tall, three-bay wide, four-bay deep, frame fraternal building constructed in 1889. The building, which sits on a brick foundation, consists of a rectangular front-gabled main block; a one-story, two-bay addition; and a onestory, one-bay shed roof addition on the rear. The roof is sheathed with asphalt shingles. The exterior of the building is clad in wood clapboard siding on the front elevation and aluminum siding on the side elevations. The front gable end is clad in wood shingles. Paired two-over-two, double-hung, arched wood-sash windows (likely original) with a molded wood lintel sit in the center bay on the second floor. Below the window is a carved datestone that reads "Odd Fellows Hall, erected A.D. 1889." A wood frieze runs above the first floor of the building. Windows on the first floor are a four-over-four, double-hung wood-sash window within a molded surround (likely original) in the north bay and paired one-over-one, double-hung, vinyl-sash replacement windows within a molded surround in the south bay. The central entrance is a single-leaf door with a single pane above a molded panel. The door is flanked by canted sidelights with molded panels and topped by a rectangular transom within a molded wood surround. A brick stoop with six steps and wrought iron railings provides access to the entrance. Windows on the northwest elevation are two-over-two, double-hung, wood-sash (likely original). The rear elevation is not visible from the public right-of-way. Windows on the southeast elevation are also two-over-two, double-hung, wood-sash (likely original).

History: Odd Fellows Hall served as the Cranbury Post Office from around 1910 to 1971, when the post office moved to its present location at 65 North Main Street (Chambers 2012:98). The subject building first appears cartographically on the 1916 Sanborn map of



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Cranbury Township as a two-story frame building with two one-story rear additions. The building is labeled as the post office with a lodge on the second floor. The 1933 Sanborn map shows no changes.

Setting:

Odd Fellows Hall is sited on a rectangular parcel (Block 32, Lot 8) located on the west side of North Main Street in Cranbury Township, Middlesex County, New Jersey. The building is oriented with its primary elevation facing northwest and is set back approximately 15 feet from North Main Street. A concrete sidewalk, which runs along North Main Street, spans the west side of the parcel. A paved driveway leads east from North Main Street past the northeast elevation of the building to a paved parking lot and a one-story garage. Shrubs adjoin the front (northwest) elevation. Odd Fellows Hall is located in a mixed residential and commercial neighborhood surrounded by properties dating from the mid-nineteenth to the early twentieth century.
