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Description:

PS&S recommends that 2 Evans Drive, constructed circa 1925-1930, is a contributing property in the Cranbury Historic District.

The 2 ½-story, side gable-roofed, rectangular-plan main block of this painted wood clapboard-clad, Colonial Revivial style frame dwelling on a parged foundation is 5-bays wide and 2 bays deep and is flanked by 1-story, hipped-roofed volumes with roofline railings on both its east and west. 2 gabled dormers with round-arch, multi-light sash windows are located on the north roof slope. Smaller, shed-roofed dormers with single-light windows are located on the south roof slope. The roofs are predominantly clad in asphalt shingle and the windows predominantly have 6/1, historic wood sash with historic shutters composed of a louvered lower panel and a solid upper panel with decorative, crescent-shape cutouts. A broad exterior, painted brick chimney centered on the west elevation. The primary entrance fronted by a concrete landing with historic door surround with a dentiled broken pediment with a central urn. The remaining bays are regularly fenestrated. The east side volume is lighted by a double window. The west side volume is lighted by a 20-light fixed windows on the second floor and 2 multi-light, quarter-round windows on the third floor. The east elevation is lighted by 2 windows on the second floor and 2 multi-light, quarter-round windows on the third floor. The east elevation is only partially visible from the public right-of-way, is lighted by 2 windows on the third floor. The south, street-facing elevation is only partially visible from the public right-of-way and includes a 9-light door with single-light transom and flanking 4/1 sash windows in the east volume.

The residence at 2 Evans Drive was not documented in the 1980 National Register of Historic Places Nomination for the Cranbury Historic District. It was evaluated in the 1989 Heritage Studies inventory as key-contributing in the district, but the reasoning for this evaluation is not clear, since, although clearly a contributing property, it is not sufficiently distinguished as a Colonial Revival design for this exceptional status. The earliest documentation of the residence is the 1933 Sanborn map, which depicts the residence as a 2-story, frame dwelling with a 1-story, full-width porch on the west elevation, a 1-story volume on the east elevation, and a basement garage. At this point, the house was part of the 1 South Main Street property. The 1974 photographic inventory of Cranbury historic buildings in the collection of the Cranbury Historical and Preservation Society shows the south elevation of the residence with a central entry and door hood, 6/1 sash windows, a 3-sided projecting bay with 6/6 sash east of the door, and secondary entrances in both side volumes. Aerial photographs and visual evidence indicate do not indicate any major construction campaigns since the residence's construction.

This property is a contributing property in the historic district because it retains integrity and historic, character-defining features such as its historic massing and fenestration patterns, historic wood windows and shutters, historic clapboard, historic wood doors, historic dormers and side porches, historic wrought iron entrance railings, and its historic chimney.

Setting:


Evans Drive is an approximately 1/2-mile long road that connects S. Main Street, to the west, to Station Road, to the south. The tree-lined, residential road is the first road on the south side of Brainerd Lake and is predominantly bordered by single-family dwellings of moderate size.
